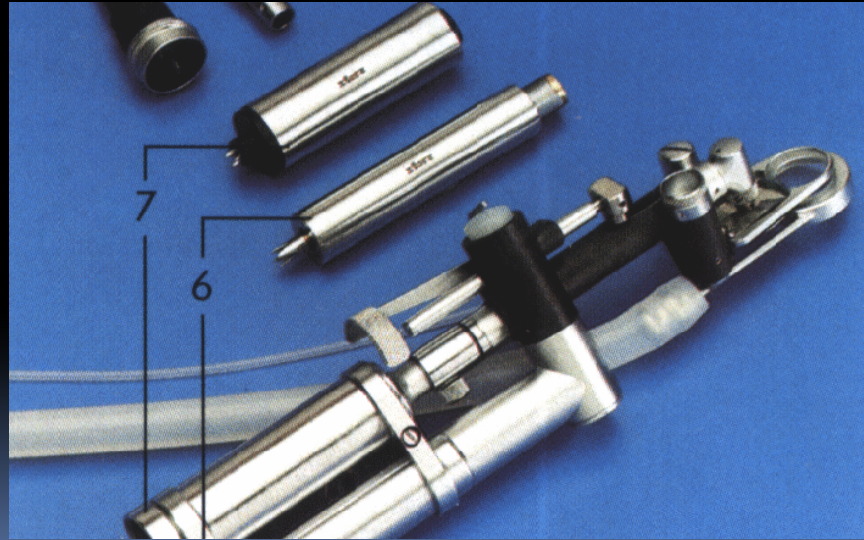

Until January 23rd, 1998 that was also the case with Michael Koenen, MD, University Eye Clinic, Mannheim, Germany.

Since 1993, Dr. Koenen has performed LASIK on hundreds of patients, with pre-operative myopia ranging from -0.50 to -10.00 D.
